
From the Desk of Pastor Rob

"God does not need your good works, but your neighbor does." – Martin Luther

"A person is good when they are willing to help others in their need." – Martin Luther in lecture on Galatians 5:22, LW vol 27

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. – James 2:14-17

As summer comes to a close here this month, we start September with the ELCA's annual day of service, God's Work Our Hands Sunday, which this year falls on September 8. Talking about good works in the church can be a tricky subject as a Lutheran because we believe that we are saved by grace through faith, not the works that we do. However, that does not mean we do not




need to do good works. We do these good works *because* we are saved as a sign of the blessings that God has given us. But these works are more than just for the sake of the church.

We often view the work of the church as similar to running a business—balancing the budget, paying the staff, and maintaining the building. But the church is far more than that. It is a community of people gathered for worship, empowered by the Holy Spirit. The church's mission goes beyond just keeping the doors open and the lights on. It extends into the neighborhoods and communities surrounding it, spreading the Good News of Jesus' resurrection and demonstrating God's love and compassion to others. The work of the church is never complete, and it is important to remember that it is not about our own benefit or glory, but about serving others and glorifying God. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, we can achieve incredible things, transforming the world for the better. This is the mission of the church, the same mission given to the apostles at the Ascension, to carry on Christ's work and share the Gospel with the world. Today, that remains our mission as the church.

We will gather after worship on September in the Fellowship Hall to assemble Blessing Bags to give out to this in need in the community. These bags are filled



It's like this for me: I walk into a Walmart with a Subway and right away my nose smells it. And the bread... that bread... makes me hungry. I wasn't hungry before - but now I am. And that smell perks up memories of baking bread and eating bread.

In my tradition we are in the summer of the Gospel of John. Specifically in the 6th chapter where Jesus talks, for the whole chapter, about being the bread of life. And for 6 weeks this summer, in our Lutheran tradition, this is the chapter that is being read in pieces parts for all of those weeks.

It can be alot about the bread of life. But, perhaps that is exactly the point. Jesus calls himself the bread of life. And we, Jesus' disciples, are supposed to be his Body in the world. The hands, the feet, the voice of Christ in the world and for the world.

Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, and walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.
